Across Indiana, Hoosiers have been celebrating the United States Navy's decision to name the newest *Freedom*-class littoral combat ship USS *Indianapolis* (LCS 17). We are proud that this new ship will bear the name of Indiana's capital city when she joins the world's most powerful naval fleet.

As the latest ship to bear the name *Indianapolis*, this great ship and her crew will carry the responsibility of a historic legacy. Ships named *Indianapolis* served after World War I, during World War II, and the Cold War. Their work is a tribute to American excellence and innovation. I am also grateful to the members of the USS *Indianapolis* Commissioning Committee for their dedication and commitment to educating and connecting Hoosiers with the crew of *Indianapolis*. The Commissioning Committee has represented our state well as they have worked tirelessly to bring crew members and Hoosiers together throughout our state, to tell the story of *Indianapolis*, and cultivate long-term relationships that will last for decades to come.
